

Editorial Committee Regulations of *Advances in Resources Research*

Resources Economics Research Board

Enacted on October 18, 2021

1. Purpose

The purpose of *Advances in Resources Research (ARR)* editorial committee is to conduct *ARR* articles editing and related works.

2. Activities

- (1) Call for submission of manuscripts
- (2) Examination of submitted manuscripts
- (3) Edit and publish
- (4) Advertising promotion

3. Configuration

The editorial committee consists of the editor-in-chief, co-editor-in-chief, deputy editor-in-chief, standing editorial board member, editorial board member, guest editorial board member, and adviser editorial board member.

3. Business of an executive

- (1) The editor-in-chief presides over the editorial committee and supervises its activities.
- (2) The co-editor-in-chief shall assist the chairman of the editor-in-chief, and in the absence of the chairman, shall represent the chairman of the editor-in-chief.
- (3) The deputy editor-in-chief shall assist the editor and co-editor.
- (4) The standing editorial board member shall assist the editor-in-chief, co-editor-in-chief, and deputy editor-in-chief.
- (5) The editorial board member shall execute their duties based on the “activities” stipulated in article 2.
- (6) The guest editorial board member shall execute the business of soliciting contributions for manuscripts and advertising and publicity.
- (7) The adviser editorial board member shall support the duties of the editor-in-chief and the co-editor-in-chief.

4. Term of office

The term of office of members of the editorial committee shall be one year. However, reappointment is not prohibited.

5. Duty

(1) The editorial committee must exercise fair control over the review process.

(2) The editorial committee selects reviewers according to the type and requirements of the submitted manuscript, and conducts the anonymous review. In doing so, the editorial committee shall select without bias the most suitable reviewers based on their field of expertise. Also, reviewers should not be people who may have a favorable or negative personal bias toward the author or subject of the submission.

(3) The editorial committee shall not disclose to others any information relating to the peer review process or the manuscript submitted or the reviewers' information.

(4) The editorial committee shall not take into account the authors' race, religion, ethnicity, sex, age, nationality, occupation, affiliation, or political beliefs in determining the manuscript to be submitted.
